Credited as Righteous Galatians 3:6-9

We see that Paul continues his argument that it is faith alone that brings about salvation and not any work of the law. He furthers his argument by pointing to Abraham and shows that he was counted as righteous because of his faith, not because of his works of obedience.

Main Idea: God sees our faith, and it is credited to us as righteousness.
